Professor Keith Hawton FMedSci DSc FRCPsych

Keith Hawton is Professor of Psychiatry and Director of the Centre for Suicide Research at Oxford University Department of Psychiatry. He is also a National Institute for Health Research Senior Investigator. For more than thirty-five years he and his research group have been conducting investigations concerning the causes, treatment, prevention and outcome of suicidal behaviour. He has received the Stengel Research Award from the International Association for Suicide Prevention (1995), the Dublin Career Research Award from the American Association of Suicidology (2000), the Research Award of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (2002) and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the European Symposium of Suicide and Suicidal Behaviour (2012), became a Fellow of the Academy of Medical Sciences (FMedSci) in May 2013 and received the Morselli Medal from the International Association of Suicide Research, Montreal, June 2013. (The Morselli Medal is the Academy's most distinguished award and is given every 2 years to individuals who have made outstanding and important lifetime contributions to the study of suicide, suicidal behaviors or suicide prevention). He has approximately 500 papers and chapters and 16 books. He is co-editor of *The International Handbook of Suicide and Attempted Suicide* (2000, Wiley), editor of *Prevention and Treatment of Suicidal Behaviour: From Science to Practice* (2005, Oxford University Press), co-author of *By Their Own Young Hand: Deliberate Self Harm and Suicidal Ideas in Adolescents* (2006, Jessica Kingsley Publishers) and co-editor of *Suicide* (a four volume major themes series) (Routledge 2012).
